

## Year 11 English Language and Literature

In Year 11 students revisit some literature texts first introduced in Year 9 and continue to develop skills for the English Language papers. The majority of the work is focused on exam preparation and learning the specific skills to answer each question on each paper.

### Methods of deepening and securing knowledge:

<b>Interleaving</b>	Low-stakes testing incorporates all previous units to enable knowledge to be retained and to emphasise links between different topics.
<b>Knowledge organisers</b>	Knowledge organisers are used in conjunction with the study of all literature texts to improve knowledge of key concepts, vocabulary and relevant contextual information.
