The Scilly Isles

The Scilly Isles are collection of 18 islands 5 of them being inhabited which are : St Marys, Tresco, St Agnes, Bryher and St Martins. St Marys

St Mary's is the largest and most popular island of the Isles of Scilly, off the southwest coast of Cornwall in England. When I visited the Scilly isles last year, we stayed on st Mary's in a little flat buildings owned by this lady called Penny. We stayed here for a week and visited lots of islands taking boats out to all of the other islands.



Tresco

Tresco is the second-biggest island of the Isles of Scilly in Cornwall, England but is a small island that only covers about 2 and a half miles.
