Curriculum design and coverage

Northallerton School & Sixth Form aims to provide students with a broad and balanced curriculum, building upon the knowledge and understanding gained at KS2. The school provides a 3-year key stage 3 and a 2-year key stage 4, however the core subjects of English, maths and science do begin their GCSE teaching towards the end of Y9 once they are confident that the subject knowledge has been secured from key stage 3. At key stage 5 students are able to select from a good range of academic and vocational courses, some of which are taught in partnership with Stokesley School & Sixth Form College to maximise the course offer.

For all of the foundation subjects there is a requirement that the KS3 national curriculum is finished for all students by the end of Year 9. Students are taught both French and Spanish for the majority of their KS3, taught by subject specialists.

Key Stage 4

In the Spring term of Year 9 students opt to take four 'option subjects'. The curriculum is designed so that students maintain a wide choice of other subjects including technology and expressive arts subjects, a second language or second humanity subject and triple science. Our curriculum offer is always kept under constant review to reflect the needs of our students and to take into account changing external requirements.

Key Stage 5

At post-16, we believe it is important for all students to follow subjects that enable the fulfilment of career ambitions. We offer an extensive range of A levels (English literature, mathematics, further mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics, French, Spanish, history and geography) as well as art, drama and theatre studies, English language, psychology, economics, music, PE, product design and religious studies. Some of these subjects are taught in partnership with Stokesley Sixth Form College and Richmond Sixth Form through our online collaboration. We are also proud of the achievements of our vocational students and we offer a range of successful vocational level three qualifications in a diverse range of areas including health and social care, applied science, business and media. Students following these courses usually progress to higher education, training or employment related to their studies.

How we meet the 16-19 study programme requirements

Students in KS5 choose 3 A level and / or level 3 vocational subjects at the start of Year 12. Occasionally students will take 4 A level subjects where the student is able to demonstrate that they have the capacity to take on the increased workload. In addition to the teaching time that students receive they commit to two hours of independent study for each subject.

The curriculum offered at KS5 ensures that there are clear progression routes to enable students to continue their post 16 education at Northallerton Sixth Form College, and to prepare them for higher education and/or the world of work. There is a strong careers programme that supports students to understand the options available and to make informed choices about their career aspirations. There is a rich and varied enrichment programme which gives students the chance to enjoy new experiences and consolidate their timetabled learning through a range of extra-curricular opportunities and experiences.
